Job Overview

MOS Professor and Coordinator of Animal Ethics and Sustainability Leadership Dr. Kendra Coulter is recruiting a research assistant for a project on horses in new Westerns. The expansion of television and film Westerns (both historical and contemporary depictions) through programs like Yellowstone raises important ethical, organizational, and cultural questions about the representations of horses and horse-human work, and the experiences of the real horses working on these sets. The research assistant will support analysis of both dimensions.

Please note that the content being viewed in this role may contain difficult material and topics including violence against people and animals, misogyny, anti-Indigenous racism, anti-Black racism, among others, and applicants should recognize and accept this before applying. The successful candidate will be expected to subscribe to the necessary streaming services if needed in order to access the content for the duration of the contract.

Responsibilities:

- 1. Focused viewing of specific films and/or television series through an equine-centric lens:
 - a) the dialogue and action involving horses and
 - b) what the horses are communicating and revealing when they are present but not made central to the plot.
- 2. Detailed note taking and research file organization.

Qualifications:

- 1. Direct experience with horses.
- 2. Correct understanding of horses’ modes of communication through their body language and behaviour.
- 3. A commitment to horses as sentient beings, (co)workers, and moral subjects.
- 4. A minimum 75% average.
- 5. Be thoroughly reliable, professional, organized, and self-motivated.
- 6. Students in the Animal Ethics and Sustainability Leadership major or minor are preferred for this role, however, this position is open to students in all modules.

Education:

- Must be a registered and returning student

Eligibility:

- Huron students who are eligible to work in Canada
